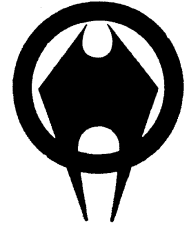


CHELSEA SPELAEOLOGICAL SOCIETY



GENERAL INFORMATION FOR PROVISIONAL MEMBERS (2011)

History

The Society in its present form was constituted in October 1959 from two groups: one was a former society of the same name founded in October 1956 whose founder members had caved as part of the 1st Chelsea Boy Scouts and the other was the London Spelæological Group which was formed in 1938. In 1964 CSS acquired a cottage in Llangattock, South Wales, "Whitewalls", from which it bases activities in that area. The cottage has 16 bunk beds, gas central heating, cooking and washing facilities, as well as a garden for camping. An extension to the cottage adding an upstairs library room, two showers, new toilets and a cave rescue store room was added in recent years.

Membership

The Society has about 80 members, encompassing a wide range of abilities from complete novice upwards. The members are now spread across the whole of the UK, and a few who live abroad continue their membership. Those based in the South East of England are now a minority within the club. New members must be 18 years of age or older and they join on a provisional basis for any six months until they become known to the club and are then usually voted up to full membership. Associate membership is intended for people who just want copies of club publications but do not intend to participate in caving. Joint membership is intended for two full members living at the same address but who want only one copy of club publications.

Indoor Meetings

The Annual General Meeting is held once a year, usually on the last Sunday in January, at a venue near Whitewalls and there is an annual club dinner the evening before this. The club no longer holds meetings in central London as very few members are now based there.

Weekend Caving Trips

The Society runs regular underground trips, using club equipment, to caving areas around Britain. In addition, expeditions to foreign caving areas are organised by members. These are advertised on the club website and in the monthly newsletter. Usually the last or the first weekend of each month is a "club weekend" at Whitewalls or elsewhere. There will be caving trips and sometimes other above-ground entertainments like a summer barbecue, canoe/kayak or mountain bike or walking trips, bonfire party and a curry night. The club has approved leaders, keys and permits for local caves such as Agen Allwedd, OFD, Dan-yr-Ogof, Daren Cilau, Craig a'r Ffynnon and OgofCapel. Use of Whitewalls costs £2.50 per night to provisional and full members (non-members pay £5). Most active full members hold a cottage key on a semi-permanent loan basis and prospective members may also borrow a front door key on payment of a £10 deposit to the Cottage Warden or Secretary.

Publications

The Society produces a monthly Newsletter that is posted free to all members. Other periodic publications, such as Records and cave surveys, are sold to members at reduced rates.

Library

The club owns an extensive library of caving publications which may be borrowed by full members. This has been moved into the new library room at Whitewalls but stocking shelves and cataloguing is not yet finished.

Website

The Society has a web site www.chelseaspelaeo.org.uk which contains up-to-date information about the club, its activities and lists external bookings for the cottage.

Subscription rates

Associate:	£20 (Year)	Provisional:	£20 (any 6 month period)
Full:	£30 (Year)	Joint Full:	£43 (Year)

The club financial year begins each October 1st. Provisional members may join or re-join at any point in the year. The above subscription rates include BCA 'non-active caver' public liability insurance. BCA operates its insurance scheme on a calendar year basis and as an active caver you should pay £11 per annum, pro rata the number of quarters or part quarters remaining. New members wishing to join should send a cheque payable to *Chelsea Spelæological Society* along with their membership application form to the Secretary. Members who are renewing a subscription should sent the payment to the Treasurer. The committee will normally consider voting provisional members up to full membership after 6 months by which time they should have become known. Temporary membership can be extended for another 6 months, but only once, if a provisional member has been unable to become known socially and as an active caver within the club. Subscription rates of full members are adjusted for those who are members of several clubs so that their BCA insurance premium is paid only once.
